grant that I may not so much seek


to be consoled as to console;

To the Teacher:

Earth day is a wonderful opportunity to teach our students about the wonder, awe, majesty and glory of God found in creation. It also reminds all that God chose us to be his stewards of the earth, a hugely blessed privilege.

The prayer service on the reverse side incorporates our Catholic beliefs regarding creation as a gift from God and humankind's call to protect the earth, all living things and live in harmony with each other. The reading is an adaptation of the Genesis creation story. For older students, you may want to use a Children's Bible for the entire Creation account (Genesis 1: 1-28; 2:1-3.) Other scripture passages that refer to God's creation: Genesis 9:8-17 (Covenant with Noah); or Psalms 8, 65, 104, 146, 147, or 148.
