 - ♦ What is the purpose of each component of the formula?

Chapter II: The Power of Forgiveness and Reconciliation

- \Rightarrow For Discussion:
 - ♦ How are the promptings/convicting of the Holy Spirit graced moments in our lives?
 - ♦ Fr. Guckin uses the sounds of Velcro (tearing apart/putting together) as an image of sin and reconciliation. How would you use this image (or another image) to teach sin and reconciliation to your students?

Chapter III: The Deadliest of the Deadly Sins (Pride, Envy, Anger)

- ⇒ Sin-Pride/Remedy-Humility; Sin-Envy/Remedy-Admiration; Sin-Anger/Remedy-Forgiveness
- \Rightarrow For Discussion:
 - ♦ From your experience in teaching, does one of these sins plague students more today than in the past? Explain.
 - \Diamond As a catechist, why is it paramount for your classroom to be a haven of forgiveness?

Chapter IV: The "Others" (Sloth, Greed, Gluttony, Lust)

- ⇒ Sin-Sloth/Remedy-Zeal for the Kingdom; Sin-Greed/Remedy-Generosity; Sin-Gluttony/Remedy-Asceticism; Sin-Lust/Remedy-Chastity
