





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THE CATECHETICAL CONVOCATION



The Catechetical Convocation is an annual faith formation event cosponsored by the Office for Catechetical Formation and the Archdiocesan Association of Parish Directors, Coordinators, and Administrators of Religious Education (PDCARE). What is the Catechist Convocation? In the early 1980's, a group of Parish Directors of Religious Education created a grass roots venue known as the "Catechist Showcase." Using a parish site, this event provided an annual opportunity for the most experienced and gifted volunteer catechists to share their practical insights and best practices in teaching the faith to children. In 1989, the "Catechist Showcase" was retitled the "Catechetical Forum" as professional presenters and broader topics were added. The Catechetical Forum was later named the Catechist Convocation as participants included both parish catechists and Catholic school teachers. Though the name has changed over the years, the PDCARE Association keeps true to the original mission of its Catechetical Convocation:

The professional and spiritual growth of the parish catechist through a sharing of theological insights, teaching methodologies, and practical applications.

Policy for Catechetical Certification Credit:

One catechetical credit for Archdiocesan Master Catechetical Certification is granted for the entire day.

In the 20th century, the field of education took massive leaps forward as new and more effective models of teaching were implemented. Religious education benefited from some of these models, but in some areas lost some of its distinctiveness and effectiveness in passing on the faith to a younger generation. Teaching the “what” of the faith is important, but only if it introduces students to the “who” of the faith, Jesus Christ.

DR. BOB RICE



Bob Rice loves being Catholic. He is a husband, father of seven, permanent deacon for the diocese of Steubenville, and Professor of Catechetics at Franciscan University of Steubenville. He has a PhD in Theology from Liverpool Hope University where he researched Catholic youth and evangelization. He has authored many books and articles, including the *Discipleship Quad Guidebooks*, and a novel about St. Peter titled, *Between the Savior and the Sea*. He is the co-host of a popular weekly podcast called *They That Hope* with Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR. Bob has recorded numerous CDs, and his music can be found on Apple Music, Spotify, and others. REV. REMIGIO MORALES



Fr. Remigio was born in Lima, the capital city of Peru. His early formation included four years of humanistic studies, which awakened in him a profound search for meaning and the deeper questions of human existence. He completed three years of Philosophy and three years of Theology, followed by a Master's degree in Dogmatic Theology and a Certificate in Theological Anthropology. His ministry has been devoted to youth, families, and the teaching of Theology, always seeking to accompany others in their encounter with Christ.

He currently serves as the Spirituality Director at St. Agatha-St. James Parish in University City, where he continues to share his love for the faith, his contemplative spirit, and his commitment to forming hearts rooted in the Gospel.

SESSION 1: WORKSHOPS

A-1. Echoing Christ: Forming Future Saints

Rev. Jordan Kelly, O.P. - Dominican Friar of the Province of Saint Joseph

The role of catechists, teachers, parents, and coaches is essential in raising up the next generation of faithful and joyful Catholics. Come and discover the Heart of this important vocation.

A-2. Echoing Christ in a Noisy World

Rev. Christopher Walsh - Pastor, St. Cecilia Parish, Philadelphia

How can we share the Gospel with young disciples and their parents amid distraction, relativism, and digital noise?

A-3. “It’s Not Difficult to Be a Saint: How Listening to and Proclaiming God’s Word Makes Saints”

Rev. Timothy Tarnacki, OSPPE, DMin. - Director of the Office for Ministry with Young Adults

Holiness often begins not with extraordinary deeds but with the simple act of listening to God’s Word. This presentation highlights how saints were formed through Scripture, preaching, and catechesis—from St. Justin the Martyr, who found in the Gospel the truth he sought as a philosopher; to St. Anthony the Great and St. Augustine of Hippo, whose lives were radically changed by hearing the Word; and through Venerable Jan Tyranowski, whose quiet witness helped shape St. John Paul II. Their stories remind us that sainthood is not complicated: when God’s Word is heard, received, and shared, saints are made.

A-4. From Encounter to Echo: Forming Future Saints in Everyday Life

Stacy Williams - Director, Office for Black Catholics, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

This presentation explores how authentic encounters with Christ lead to lives that echo His love, justice, and mercy forming future saints not only through doctrine but through lived discipleship, community, and courageous witness.

A-5. Forming Future Saints- The Parent Connection

Parents are primary educators and leaders of faith for children, yet seem to need catechesis themselves today. Ideas for creating opportunities to open hearts and minds of parents to allow God to reveal His love to them, will be presented.

A-6. The Wedding Feast at Cana, Jesus and Mary

Sister Carolyn Braun, IHM - Principal, St. Laurence Catholic School, Upper Darby

Throughout Scripture, Jesus uses parables and experiences to teach us. In the Wedding Feast at Cana, Jesus teaches us three things about Mary that I have found very helpful.

B-1. Unworthy? Serve Anyway.

Dan Tarrant - Founder and Director, Personally Catholic

Saint Paul said, "Imitate me as I imitate Christ" (1 Cor 1:11). He knew that leading people to Christ required being like Christ himself. So how do imperfect people like us invite Catholics to be Saints? Discover the answer to this question and learn how grace really works in this session.

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B-3. Voice of the Master: Guiding Children Toward Sainthood

Sister Margaret Rose Adams, IHM - Assistant Superintendent, Office for Catholic Education, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

We are all committed to shaping hearts and minds for holiness. This session will explore practical strategies and spiritual insights to help you echo the voice of Christ in your teaching, guiding children toward a life of virtue and sainthood. Together, we'll deepen our understanding of the catechist's mission and discover how to create a Christ-centered environment that nurtures faith, love, and discipleship.

B-4. Exploring Hands-on Catechesis

Nancy Sánchez - Director of Religious Education, St. Agnes Parish, West Chester

Hands-on catechesis is a method of religious education that uses physical and sensory experiences to teach faith. This approach allows children to explore their relationship with God through activities and materials that make scriptural and liturgical mysteries tangible. It focuses on a child's natural wonder about God and is designed to form lifelong disciples rather than just teaching concepts.

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B-6. Singing the Faith Into Hearts

Micah Sumner - Assistant Superintendent, Office for Catholic Education, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

This workshop invites catechists to reflect on how we can reach the hearts of those who are struggling, questioning, or feeling disconnected from their faith. Through spiritual reflection, light-hearted humor, and the gentle use of song, we'll explore ways to echo Christ's love in authentic and healing ways. Participants will leave encouraged to bring joy, compassion, and creativity into their ministry as they help form future saints.

B-7. Mission Skill: How to Pray with Someone

Meghan Cokeley - Director, Office for the New Evangelization, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

Come and learn an important skill that every missionary disciple needs: how to pray spontaneously with someone. Instead of saying "I will pray for you," you will be able to say to someone, "Can I pray with you for that right now?" Praying with someone creates an opportunity for the person to encounter Jesus in the very moment of their struggle or need. This session will teach you a structured way to do this and then you will have the opportunity to practice.

B-8. Echoing Christ Through Inclusion: Supporting Learners with ADHD

Natalie Morales - Director, Office for Persons with Disabilities, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

This workshop will provide practical strategies to support children with ADHD in parish programs, helping them fully engage in faith formation. Together, we'll explore ways to remove barriers and create inclusive spaces where every child can encounter Christ and thrive.

B-9. Who Is In Your Saint Squad This Year?

Christine Flack - Director of Religious Education, Our Lady of Grace Parish, Penndel

The Saints are relatable witnesses who put Christ at the center of their lives. They are given to us to guide us on our journey of faith. How can we help those we catechize to develop a Holy heavenly friend group for life? Practical ideas for all ages.

C-7. Making Christ visible through the echoes of the Gospel

Deacon Chike Egbufoama - Transitional Deacon, Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter & Paul, Philadelphia

This means that the Gospel is no longer only read; it is heard again in a living voice, a breathing body, a surrendered life. Here I am lord, I come to do your will!!! An echo is not an invention of its own sound; it is the faithful return of an original Word. So too the Christian, and even more the priest, is not called to be a new message but a resonating chamber in which the eternal Word continues to vibrate in history. When the Church forms disciples, she is not producing religious professionals but human sacraments whose very existence allows the Incarnate God to pass once more through flesh, time, and culture. In such lives, the Cross becomes intelligible, mercy becomes visible, and resurrection becomes credible. The saint, therefore, is the place where the silence of the world is broken and the Father declares, through a human life, "This is my beloved Son, listen to Him."
