DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. *Did you know that there were two creation stories?*
2. *Although these stories are familiar, what was something that struck you personally for the first time?*
3. *In your opinion, is the Book of Genesis fact or fiction?*

LECTURE 1: AN OVERVIEW OF GOD'S VISION FOR HUMANITY

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *As a human person, what do you desire? (i.e., What is your vision for humanity)?*
2. *What does it mean to be human? (i.e., What is a human person?)*
3. *What is it that undermines our desires and our identity as a human person? (i.e., What thwarts our vision?)*

LECTURE 2: FINDING GOD’S VISION IN GENESIS

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *With God’s vision for humanity, why is the term “very good” significant?*
2. *God models a day of rest in His creation plan, and later commands us to “keep holy” on this day with the intent that we rest in Him, who, as we know, is the source of all life and all that is good. Is the “Sabbath” and “keeping holy” a sacred practice today? Why or why not?*
3. *How do you “keep holy the Sabbath” and is it in accord with what He has asked of those who profess Him as their Lord and God? Why or why not?*

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *What would you expect life to be like if we lived in perfect harmony with God and one another?*

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *What are the implications of God’s searching the Garden for Adam and Eve and crying out, “Where are you?”*
2. *Contemplating the sin that you struggle with in daily life, how is this personal sin a replay of Original Sin?*
3. *What are the implications of God searching out Adam and Eve in the Garden in relation to your own sinfulness and need to be found?*
