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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *Fr. Banecker noted that we who catechize are frontline evangelists. In what ways do you evangelize others in your ministry?*
2. *Fr. Banecker also noted that we meet Christ in the Sacraments. How did the dying man and his family encounter Christ in the story Father shared?*

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1. *Sacraments are real encounters with the true presence of God in and through the Person of Jesus. Is this your experience of sacraments? Why or why not?*
2. *In your ministry, how can you help create the conditions for someone to encounter Jesus and the love of God in a sacrament?*

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. *Thinking of Fr. Banecker's explanation of a sacrament, how would you describe a sacrament in an age-appropriate way that helps someone feel excited to receive it and encounter Christ?*
2. *Every sacrament includes the Word of God because God speaks to us and becomes present through His Living Word. Listening to Scripture prepares our hearts and minds to receive the sacrament. Share a time when you knew God was speaking to you through His Word.*

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How can you help students to see the beauty of the Catholic faith and lead them to a personal encounter with Christ Jesus in your role as a catechist?
